

A3 Use drama to influence issues

This classroom-based module encourages students and teachers to discuss if drama has a role to play in resolving issues.

Art teacher's lesson plan

Suitable for teaching at most secondary schools years or levels

Use drama to influence issues

How to use this module

Photocopy required numbers of the module. Distribute to students, invite them to choose their characters and then either individually or in groups act out the roleplay and work through the discussion and activities. Use as a class lesson or within your teaching plan.

Lesson duration

One class lesson depending on objectives.

Achievement objectives

• Students initiate ideas and make individual and collective decisions to plan and develop drama.

Assessment

- Students are aware of how to initiate ideas and make individual and collective decisions in order to plan and develop drama.
- Students participate in the class activities.

Characters

Students are characters who discuss the issue of a friend's hair being the reason for their suspension from a local club. They become motivated to seek change and discuss alternatives, which include staging a small drama presentation. Characters are One, Two, Three, Four, Five, Six, Seven, Eight, Nine and Ten.

STUDENTS FIVE TO TEN ARE SITTING TOGETHER. SECOND GROUP OF STUDENTS, ONE TO FOUR, ENTER.

ONE	Have you heard?
FIVE	Heard what?
TWO	About Treen.
SIX	What happened?
THREE	Suspended from the club.
SEVEN	What for?
FOUR	Hair.
FIVE	Hair?
ONE	Treen's hair colour was too much for the club captain.
SIX	What colour was it?
THREE	All colours.
SEVEN	Can Treen be suspended from the club?
FOUR	The captain says so.
FIVE	What happened?
ONE	The captain called Treen into the clubrooms, said that Treen's hair
	colour was unacceptable and had to be changed. It was purple with
	white and orange spots at the time. Treen said sure and went out
	and dyed it green, with red and white stripes. When Treen turned
	up at the club last weekend the captain said Treen was suspended
	until further notice.
SEVEN	What further notice?
THREE	Suspended until the hair was changed to a normal colour.
FIVE	Normal?
SIX	Green with red and white stripes is normal for Treen.
NINE	Did they ask Treen about it?
ONE	They said Treen hadn't taken notice of any warnings.
TWO	What did Treen say?
ONE	Treen said that the hair was dyed after every warning. Treen said
	that all the rules had been obeyed. Treen changed the hair colour
	every time asked.

Worksheet Discussion and activities

Students perform the play then work through some or all of the following discussion and activities, either individually or in groups.
