

C3 Interview a mystery guest to identify their career

By interviewing a mystery guest and having to guess what they are doing, students will pick up useful information about careers, jobs and training.

Careers lesson plan

Suitable for teaching at most secondary school years or levels

Interview a mystery guest to identify their career

How to use this module

Photocopy required numbers of the module. Distribute to students, invite them to choose their characters and then either individually or in groups act out the roleplay and work through the discussion and activities. Use as a class lesson or within your teaching plan.

Lesson duration

One-two class lessons depending on objectives.

Achievement objectives

By asking questions, students are introduced to the range of different jobs and job options.

Assessment

- Students become aware of are able to research in detail occupational information using appropriate resources.
- Students are able to ask useful questions in the class quiz.

Characters

The classroom is a television interview set with two chairs facing each other. The interviewer, Ca Reer, and students Three to Twenty interview BG to identify BG's job.

- CA BG. How are you feeling?
- BG Fantastic. I'm really looking forward to being involved in today's show.
- CA That's tremendous.
- BG And a big hello to everyone in the audience.
 - AUDIENCE APPLAUDS.

Our guest is BG and you have to guess what BG's job is by asking questions. You can ask questions about what BG does, what training BG might have done, What BG likes about the job, anything you want so that you can find out what BG does. One question at a time, and please raise your hand if you have a question?

ONE (RAISES HAND) Do you work outside or inside?

BG I can work in both.

TWO (RAISES HAND) Are there any courses that you need to do your job?
